Suggested revision techniques:	<p>Cover, check, write, repeat. Get your parents/carers/family/friends/pets to ask you questions. Create flashcards to summarise info and define keywords. Put post-it notes around the house with keywords on. Condense your notes onto a page a topic. GCSEPod and Educake websites. Seneca is also a good one.</p>
Common mistakes to avoid:	<p>DON'T ANSWER THE GLACIERS SECTION! Rivers DO NOT flow uphill. Erosion DOES NOT happen overnight, It takes many, many years. Weathering weakens rocks, erosion wears it away. Mass movement DOES happen overnight. Attrition DOES NOT erode the river channel or cliffs. The small trickle at the source IS NOT a different river to the wide and deep river at its mouth. Rivers ALSO empty out into lakes as well as the sea. Urban growth rates are faster in LICs. Cities are growing faster in LICs and NEEs. Urban change means what we learnt about Birmingham.</p>
