This week has been an excellent start to the mock examinations for our Year 11 and 13 students. They have two weeks of examination practice for students to experience the full suite of exams that they will have in the summer. This will provide valuable information for staff to give feedback for students to improve before their real examinations. The students have been excellent in their conduct and attendance for these exams. A reminder that breakfast club operates from 8:15am and we always encourage students to fuel themselves well for exams. The hub and staff are always here to support and encourage during what can be a stressful time. Please speak with your young person about resting this weekend as the management of energy levels is just as important as the revision for the exams. Please see tasks on ClassCharts that teachers have set for revision to prepare for the exams.

I have attached the **School Travel Policy** for parents and carers to read as we always strive to keep our students safe to and from school. Please can we ask that students are dropped off outside the blue gates and walk into school along the barrier pathway which we have taken great care to ensure the safety of students away from the traffic. Can we also encourage parents not to park on school site or take up car parking spaces during morning and afternoons as we have had instances where staff have been unable to park. I have had continued discussions with Holywell to jointly ensure the safety of our young people and they would also like to remind parents to use Gunner Lane and not park on school site to ensure we minimise the traffic where students walk and keep our young people safe.

We have introduced our **Home School Agreement Policy** which outlines what you can expect to receive from Waseley Hills High School, what standards we expect the students to meet during their time with us and how we would like to ensure a partnered approach with parents and carers to secure the best education for our students. Please take the time to read through this and, as you would expect, we take a zero tolerance approach to abuse in person, on the phone or in writing and operate a by appointment only meeting schedule to ensure the good working order of the school day to day. Many thanks in advance for your continued support with this as we continue to strive to raise standards.
